INTRODUCTION

The Grade Eight (8) Curriculum is designed to provide students with the requisite skills and practice to build on the foundation set in Grade Seven. In this way the children will be able to apply the correct grammatical concepts and rules more effectively as well as extend their knowledge of these concepts to more complex constructions to which they will be exposed.

Written expressions in the Standard English though difficult for most of our students, will be the major focus of this group to ensure that the gap between Creole interference and the Standard is bridged.

The thematic approach adopted at Grade Seven will be applied at this stage to enable students to develop a higher level of proficiency in the Standard.
